

MOSAIC Scholarship Video Essay — Submission Guide

Thank you for your interest in Mount St. Joseph University and the MOSAIC Scholars Program. As part of the application process, we are asking all interested students to submit a video essay answering the following prompt:

What motivates you to be a part of the MOSAIC Scholars Program, and how do you plan to contribute to an inclusive community at the Mount and beyond?

Video Essay Instructions

- Content to cover:
 - **Introduction:** Begin your video by stating your name and sharing a little bit about yourself.
 - **Motivation:** Explain what draws you to the MOSAIC Scholars Program
 - **Contribution:** Describe specific ways you will contribute to an inclusive community at the Mount and in the wider community.
- Length
 - Your video can be up to 2 minutes long.
- Upload Your Video to YouTube
 - Sign in to YouTube Studio
 - In the top right corner, click Create and then Upload videos
 - Select the video file you would like to upload
 - Once uploaded, click Edit on your file to add your video details
 - Set the video visibility to Unlisted so only people with the link can view it
- Email Your Video Link
 - Go to your video on youtube.com
 - Below the video, click Share
 - A panel will open with sharing options. Click Copy Link
 - Paste the copied link into an email addressed to Mission&Belonging@msj.edu
 - Include your name in the subject line of the email

If You Do Not Have Access to a Camera

If you do not have access to a phone, tablet, or computer with a camera, here are a few options to help you complete your video:

- Use a campus or local library computer lab. Many have webcams and basic video recording software
- Ask your school counselor if you can record your video during or after school hours
- Ask a friend or family member if you can use their phone or device to record your video
